FINAL JUDGMENT

Plaintiffs, Raymond J. Obuchowski, Esq., the case trustee, and Gary and Sharon Bricker, filed a two-count Complaint seeking the denial of discharge of Debtor Robert Patrick Mick ("the Debtor") pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 727(a)(2)(A) [Count I] and pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 727(a)(4)(A) [Count II]. Mick filed a timely answer and appeared to defend his position on the merits.

AFTER A TRIAL ON THE MERITS and in conformity with and pursuant to the Court's Memorandum of Decision of even date, granting judgment in favor of the Plaintiffs,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the relief sought in Count II of the Plaintiffs' Complaint, seeking a denial of discharge for the making of a false oath pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 727(a)(4)(A), is GRANTED and judgment is entered in favor of the Plaintiffs.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the relief sought in Count I of the Plaintiffs' Complaint, seeking a denial of discharge for the transfer or concealment of assets with the intent to hinder, delay or defraud the case trustee and creditors pursuant to 11 U.S.C. § 727(a)(2)(A), is DENIED.
