CERTIFICATION OF DECISION
UNDER 28 U.S.C. § 158(D)(2)

For the reasons set forth in the memorandum of decision of even date, THE COURT FINDS the Plaintiffs have established the criteria required for certification under both alternative components of 28 U.S.C. § 158(d)(2)(A)(i), as well as under 28 U.S.C. § 158(d)(2)(A)(ii), as follows:

- (1) The Decision (AP # 20-1003, doc. ## 63, 64; AP # 20-1004, doc. ## 61, 62) involves both
 - (a) a question of law as to which there is no controlling decision of the Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit or the United States Supreme Court; and
 - (b) a matter of public importance.
- (2) The Decision involves a question of law requiring resolution of conflicting decisions within the Second Circuit.

Therefore, THIS COURT CERTIFIES the Decision reflects the circumstances specified in 28 U.S.C. § 158(d)(2)(A)(i) and (ii) and makes this certification to fulfill its statutory duty, as set out in 28 U.S.C. § 158(d)(2)(B), and in accordance with Bankruptcy Rule 8006.
